

From the Desk of Rev. James Hawley

I remember the beginning. Our daughter was home for break on March 11. One simple word—"wow"—started it. She was looking at her phone. The NBA game between the Jazz and the Thunder was postponed. The dominos started to fall and shortly we went from "normal" to pandemic on the grand scale.

On March 16, San Francisco became the first major city to issue a stay at home order. The day before, March 15, was the last time we worshipped in the sanctuary.

As I write this, seventy-two days have passed since that time. That is twenty-six days longer than Lent—thirty-two if you don't count the Sundays. That is forty-nine days longer than Advent. It is thirty-two days longer than it took the flood waters to recede. At this point we are hoping we do not challenge the forty years the people were in the wilderness.

Seventy-two days feels like the wilderness. And like that band of former slaves, we are starting to get restless. We have manna but we want quail. We wonder what is taking so long. Memorial Day weekend was full of scenes right out of Exodus 32: "[Aaron] took the gold from them, formed it in a mold, and cast an image of a calf; and they said, "These are your gods, O Israel...They rose early the next day, and offered burnt offerings...and the people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to revel."

The Lord was not pleased that day and that is a lesson we need to heed. Although the wall to wall revelers at the Lake of the Ozarks are not exactly idolaters, they do present an image of blatant disregard for their own and others' welfare. Into the fire went the advice of scientists and the urging of our more concerned public officials and out came the golden calf of hedonistic pleasure.

There was a lot of bloodshed associated with the golden calf. Moses orders the sons of Levi to "kill your brother, your friend, your neighbor" for disobeying. We will do no such thing. At least not directly. But the sad truth is that every beach blanket revelry or mask-less assault neighbor commits on neighbor will do the work for us. At least Moses was honest about the cost of human life that comes with such selfishness. Today, when "three thousand of the people fall", it won't be the Lord's doing. It will be ours.
